Permanent Crowns/Bridges

- After the final cementation of your restoration, it may take a few days to get used to your new crown or bridge. As with the temporary, if the bite does not feel balanced, or if you have sensitivity for more than a few days, please call the office.
- Do not chew hard or sticky foods on the restoration for 24 hours from the time they were cemented. The cement must set up during that time to have optimum strength.
- With proper care, the permanent crown should last for several years. Proper brushing, flossing and regular 6-month (minimal) cleanings are required to help you retain the final restoration. It is important to keep the tooth at the edge of the crown near the gum line clean, so it does not decay.
- Be sure to call for an appointment if you have concerns. Often, small problems that develop around the restoration can be found at an early stage and corrected easily but waiting for a longer time may require re-doing the restoration.
- I realize that I have been given the opportunity to make any changes to the permanent crown/bridge before final cementation.
- I understand that any cosmetic changes after final cementation may result in an additional cost.
